

From the Director of Parish Formation & Mission

"Go in peace, your faith has saved you."



"Go in peace." How fitting this formula is for dismissal at the conclusion of Mass! Or, the more elaborate formula: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." For, on more than one occasion, Jesus spoke these very words following an encounter with someone who approached Him in faith. To the woman with a hemorrhage, who was healed by touching the fringe of His garment, He said, "Daughter, your faith has saved you; go in peace" (Lk 8:48). And He said to the Penitent Woman, traditionally taken to be St. Mary Magdalene, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace" (Lk 7:50).

In the Gospel reading for last Sunday (Mark 10:46–52), Jesus spoke the first part of this blessing to the blind man, Bartimeaus, whom He healed. Like the woman with a hemorrhage, Bartimeaus was desperate. Who, after all, can heal blindness? But because he had heard of Jesus' miracles, in faith and desperate hope he called out, twice, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" In response, Jesus gave the instruction, "Call him." And so, Mark records, "They called the blind man, saying to him, 'Take heart. Get up; he is calling you." Then,

Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" We are not surprised by his answer, "Let me recover my sight." To which Jesus replies, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." And Mark recounts, "And immediately he recovered his sight and followed him on the way."

Jesus wanted to elicit this act of faith and hope from Bartimaeus, and He desires to elicit acts of faith and hope from all of us in every liturgy, and especially the sacraments. For, as the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches, "When the Spirit encounters in us the response of faith which he has aroused in us, he brings about genuine cooperation. Through it, the liturgy becomes the common work of the Holy Spirit and the Church" (CCC, 1091). "The most intimate cooperation of the Holy Spirit and the Church is achieved in the liturgy" (CCC, 1108).

Our role is to cry out in desperation of needing God's mercy for healing from sin. How consoling it is to know that He is pleased with this offering of faith and hope! Throughout the ages, Christ's apostolic Church assures us, "Take heart. Get up; He is calling you!" The faith and hope that we bring to Mass is already His gift, which is meant to lead us to Him and to respond to His question, "What do you want me to do for you?" By faith, we know what to ask for. By faith, we know what He wants to do for us. And so, at Mass, we invoke His mercy: "Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy." "Lamb of God, Who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, Who takes away the sins of the world, prant us peace."

The peace that Jesus offers us is the peace of knowing that He has forgiven our sins and restored us to communion with His Father. It is a peace that the world cannot give us, for there is no power in the world that can forgive sins. Only God, in His mercy, can forgive sins. And so, like Bartimaeus, we come to the liturgy, especially to the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Reconciliation, crying out, "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me." To which Jesus responds, "What do you want me to do for you?" To which we respond, "Let me know the Father's love." And this is precisely what He desires to do for us, and actually does it, in every sacrament, especially in the Eucharist.

So, it is highly fitting that the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Holy Mass should end with these most consoling words of Jesus, "Go in peace!" And, we can still hear Jesus adding, "Your faith in the love that God has for you has saved you." Finally, after this saving encounter with Jesus in the Church's sacraments, like Bartimaeus, we follow Jesus along the way of our daily lives, ever mindful of what, in His great mercy, He has done for us, and glorifying Him by proclaiming, both by the way that we live and by our words, "His mercy endures forever!"
